INTRODUCTION

THIS EXHIBITION HAS BEEN ARRANGED to represent those artists whose principal medium is watercolour. 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RITA ANGUS was born in Hastings in 1908. She took art lessons from G. H. Elliott when she was a child and attended. Elam School of Fine Arts, Auckland, for a short while. Between these periods she received her education at Palmerston North-Girls' High School and had four years at Canterbury School of Art. Christehurch. Miss Angus has exhibited in New Zealand and overseas and is a member of the Hawke's Bay and East Coast Art Society, the Canterbury Society of Arts, and the Academy of Fine Arts, Wellington. She is represented in the collections of the Robert McDougall Art Gallery, Christehurch, the Hawke's Bay Art Gallery, Napier, and the Auckland City Art Gallery. This year she was awarded a travelling scholarship.

OLIVIA SPENCER BOWER was horn at St Neots, Hunting donshire, England, and came out to New Zealand in 1920. She received her art education at the Canterbury School of Arts and at the Slade School and Grosvenor School of Modern Art in London. Her work is almost exclusively confined to watercolours of New Zealand landscorpes. She exhibits mainly in Christeharch and is represented in the Auckland and Christeharch Art Galleries.

GABRIELLE HOPE was born at Lower Hutt in 1916 but has lived in Auckland now for some years. She has exhibited intermittently: with the Waikato Society of Arts, in Auckland with the Society of Arts (including a one-man show), and in the 1955 Unit Two exhibition, in Christchurch and in Wellington. She is represented in individual collections (see 'A Private Collection of New Zealand Paintings,' catalogue of an exhibition in the Auckland City Art Gallery during August of this year) and in the Auckland City Art Gallery.

ERIC LEE-JOHNSON was born at Suva, Fiji, in 1908, but his family settled not long after in New Zealand. He received his training at Elam School of Fine Arts, Auckland, and went to London in 1930 where he worked in advertising agencies as a commercial artist. He studied in England at the London Central School of Arts and Crafts and at the Camberwell School, centre of the South London group, and exhibited with the latter for some years. Returning to New Zealand in 1938, he worked again in advertising agencies until a little over ten years ago when he retired to paint full time. He has lived for the last few years in the Hokianga district. Pictures by Lee-Johnson are in most major New Zealand art galleries.

T. A. McCORMACK is a Wellington artist, born in Napier. A painter of seas, rivers, skies and landscape subjects, still-lifes, flowers and occasionally figures, he is represented in the National Gallery and other principal New Zealand art galleries, though his work is mainly in private collections in New Zealand and abzoad.
