GUERCINO: BUST OF A GIRL IN PROFILE

If this girl's head was drawn as a study for a particular painting is difficult to say, but the character of the head is, however, typical of the women's heads in many paintings by Guercino. The method employed in this drawing suggests that it was done with speed, and its general effect seems to indicate a practical purpose rather than a drawing executed for its own sake.

The artist, Giovanni Francesco Barbieri, but generally known by the name of Guercino, is one of the more important Italian artists working in the seventeenth century. He was trained in the school of Lodovico Carracci, but because of his youth he could not have been more than a pupil of the master. Even in his early paintings he shows an independance from the Carracci style of figure painting. Guercino developed a manner which made use of strong light effects, with warm, glowing colours and an almost Baroque conception of movement. G.H.B.

GABBIANI: THE PRESENTATION OF THE VIRGIN

Amongst the Florentine nobility Gabbiani was counted one of the most popular painters of his time. In style he can be considered a follower of Carlo Maratti, but Gabbiani is more academic in his ideas about painting. In Florence he was the chief exponent of the classical trend which had become established in Rome. He was an artist with obvious ability,

COVER Sir Jacob Epstein, 1880-1959 Sunita. ca 1925-29 Charcoal drawing, 21 x 18 ins known for his skill in producing precise compositions with figures in well chosen attitudes, yet his work tends to be dry and impersonal.

To a large extent this drawing, in the Gallery's Mackelvie Collection, illustrates Gabbiani's rather rigid classicism. Even allowing for the slightly awkward appearance of the kneeling woman holding the offering, the general placement of the figures is well conceived, as are the tonal values, but in its final effect the formal attainment of correctness in composition dominates over any personal feelings the artist may have felt for the

GAINSBOROUGH: LANDSCAPE

This drawing was purchased in 1956. It is one of three works by the artist in the Collection, and alongside the portraits of John Sparrow and George Lavington, helps to give a more balanced view of his work. This is because Gainsborough considered himself firstly as a landscape painter whose portraits were often done simply to make a living. Mary Woodall for example, in her introduction for the Arts Council's Gainsborough exhibition of 1949, writes that 'his vision was that of a landscape painter, primarily interested in the unifying and evanescent effects of light'. Our quick drawing reveals, on a small scale, something of this concern. It conveys the effect of strong localised light seen through varying densities of tree foliage. The familiar group of peasants that is only dimly seen in the foreground gives scale to the subject. z R R

EPSTEIN: SUNITA

This drawing, purchased for the Gallery in 1957, was formerly in Arnold Haskell's collection and was used to illustrate his book *The sculptor speaks*. It is a particularly good example of Epstein's portrait drawing and the subject is amongst the better known of the sculptor's models. Epstein, who had a preference for exotic models, came across the Indian woman Sunita (as he called Amina Peerbhoy) in charge of a stall at the Wembley World Fair. With her small son and her younger sister, Sunita went to live with the Epsteins at Guilford Street where they would always be available for use as models. Of the two women, Sunita, with her striking features and her look of melancholy, appears to have been preferred by the sculptor. Epstein made a vast number of drawings of Sunita, either alone or with her sister Anita or her son Enver.

Between 1925 and 1931 Epstein also modelled from Sunita. There are four portraits, a rather awkward half-size nude called the *Reclining Goddess*, and Epstein also had her pose with her son for the *Madonna and child* of 1926-27. Later her features are recalled by the sculptor in the head of *Lucifer* and in the central seated figure in *Social Consciousness*.

Gifts and Bequests

Gifts to the Art Gallery in the form of cash from income upward to £25 are allowable for purposes of income tax deductions. Gifts in the form of paintings, or other property do not qualify for such deductions. Gifts to the Art Gallery of money or property would not attract gift duty, and the value of such gifts made during the donor's lifetime would not form part of his dutiable estate. An exception to this is where an intending donor declares a gift to the Art Gallery, but reserves to himself, during his life, an interest in the property so that the full beneficial interest does not attract duty, but the property remains part of the donor's estate and qualifies for purposes of estate duty.

Auckland Gallery Associates The aims of the Associates are to stimulate and sustain public interest in the Art Gallery; to extend the Gallery's influence throughout the community; and to acquire funds through gifts, subscriptions and bequests, for the purpose of adding to the Art Gallery's collection of New Zealand paintings, drawings and sculpture.

Any member of the public is eligible for membership. Members are invited to previews of exhibitions arranged by the Art Gallery, to lectures, discussions, film evenings, and social functions arranged by the Associates. Regular newsletters are sent out, and Members also receive the Art Gallery's Quarterly. Further information can be obtained from the Hon Secretary, c/o Auckland City Art Gallery.
