Born 1924 in Edinburgh of Italian parents. Studied at Edinburgh College of Art 1943 and at the Slade School of Art, London 1944-7. Held his first one-man exhibition in London at the Mayor Gallery 1947. Worked in Paris 1947-50 and studied surrealist and dada documents. Taught textile design at the Central School of Art 1949-55 and sculpture at St Martin's School of Art 1955-8. Worked on several architectural projects 1950-4 including fountains for the Festival of Britain 1951 and for a park in Hamburg 1953. First one-man exhibition in New York at the Betty Parsons Gallery 1960. Won the David E. Bright Award for the Best Sculptor under 45 at the Venice Biennale 1960. A visiting Professor in sculpture and design at the Hamburg Hochschule 1960-2.
