# This Centennial Exhibition forms part of the exhibition programme marking the reopening of the Edmiston Wing.

#### INTRODUCTION

In past years this gallery has mounted annual exhibitions of Contemporary New Zealand painting and sculpture, assembling them in the form of broad surveys of current work of contemporary New Zealand artists.

This exhibition, the first of the Gallery's new survey shows, is of a more specific nature than those of previous years. In this instance it concentrates on those painters and sculptors born no earlier than 1940, thus giving the public the opportunity to familiarise themselves with the works of artists of this age group. The show has received strong support from both painters and sculptors throughout the country and as a result reflects the broad and varied field in which these artists are working – both stylistically and technically.

The Director of the Gallery is indebted to Mr Colin McCahon who very generously assisted with the preliminary selection of works to be included in the exhibition but the final onus for selection or rejection remained the director's responsibility. This proved to be a burden as some entries fell into a marginal category and had to be rejected for several reasons, amongst which were included indifferent presentation, or, in other cases, the idea contained in the work did not seem to have been sufficiently developed.

Due to circumstances beyond our control this exhibition will not tour the country as has been the case with previous contemporary shows; however, it is hoped that we may have the opportunity to tour future survey exhibitions.
