

TARAWERA 1886

With the assistance of the Queen Elizabeth II Arts Council of New Zealand

This exhibition commemorates the eruption of 10 June 1886, when the Tarawera volcano obliterated the famous pink and white terraces of Rotomahana, and tragically destroyed the villages of the tangata whenua, Ngati Tuhourangi.

From its 'discovery' in 1841 to its destruction in 1886, Rotomahana and its terraces became the most frequently depicted of all New Zealand's scenic wonders. Here is a broad range of this work, encompassing watercolours, photographs, oil paintings, and published maps and prints. Essentially this is art produced by tourists, and later for tourists – pictures that inevitably contributed to the international fame of what was called the eighth wonder of the world.

The spectacular destruction of the terraces was documented by George Valentine and Charles Blomfield, who had earlier contributed some of the most compelling pictures of pre-eruption Rotomahana. The desolation was soon known as 'The New Wonderland', for the eruption spelt not an end, but rather a change of focus for tourism in this district. Instead of Te Wairoa and Rotomahana, there were now the Buried Village, the craters of Tarawera, and the new thermal wonders of Waimangu.


