FIGURE PAINTER, SOCIAL COMMENTATOR, portraitist, creator of sumptuously decorative allegories: A. Lois White (1903-1984) is one of New Zealand's most distinctive painters of the mid twentieth century. Although she is well known through several frequently reproduced works, this is the first exhibition to reveal the full range of her art.

The critical controversy provoked by *War makers* in 1937 secured White's reputation as a political commentator. Here are the other works in which she responded to topical issues such as the Depression and World War II. Her 'war art', with its uniquely civilian viewpoint, contrasts with official war art of the time.

Yet alongside her political compositions White was also painting stylised groups of women at leisure: dancing, playing music, swimming, or relaxing. These luscious fantasies are accompanied by Biblical subjects, usually from the Old Testament.

White's work stands apart from New Zealand's dominant tradition of landscape painting, as well as from modernist schools of abstraction. She gradually became alienated from her peers, and her themes – religious, political, sexual – were often lost on contemporary audiences.

Puritanical decorum and nationalist art history both conspired in the neglect of A. Lois White's true achievements. Now, her blend of traditional narrative and Art Deco eroticism speaks to a generation more ready to accept a stylised art which unashamedly celebrates the female body.
