## What's Provided

- A2 sized paper
- $2 \times 2$ B pencils
- $3 \times$ sticks of medium-to-hard willow charcoal
- $1 \times$ piece of sandpaper for sharpening charcoal
- $1 \times$ kneadable eraser


## What you'll need to bring

- $1 \times$ canvas no larger than A2* $(420 \times 600 \mathrm{~mm})$ *you will have the option of choosing whether you work with an A2 or A3 canvas size after the first lesson
- $1 \times$ A3 canvas pad


## PAINTING AND DRAWING MATERIALS

- $1 \times$ pair of scissors (for cutting canvas off-cuts if necessary)
- $1 \times$ masking tape
- $1 \times$ large flat palette (no plates please)
- $1 \times$ odourless turpentine
- $2 \times$ screw-cap jars
- $1 \times$ mahl stick (optional)
- $1 \times$ oil medium**
- $1 \times$ roll paper towels
- $1 \times$ plastic bag for tissues and rubbish
- $1 \times$ palette knife
- $1 \times$ plumb line or knitting needle for measuring (optional)


## BRUSHES

Studio Art Supplies and Gordon Harris have a wide range of oil brushes in stock; depending on your canvas size you should use brushes relative to the size of your canvas.

If purchasing from Gordon Harris or Studio Art Supplies I recommend a range of sizes based on the sizes below.

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I usually use a minimum of 3 brushes in one sitting. I designate one for my shadows, dark lights, lights, or varying hues, and one clean brush to softly merge brush strokes.

Warehouse Stationery have good inexpensive brushes in the DAS range - their durability may be shorter than professional quality, but they do the job.

I recommend, as a minimum:

- $2 \times$ DAS Long Handle Synthetic Filbert \#18
- $2 \times$ DAS Long Handle Synthetic Filbert \# 8
- $2 \times$ DAS Long Handle Synthetic Filbert \# 4
- $2 \times$ DAS Long Handle Synthetic Filbert \# 0
- $2 \times$ DAS Long Handle Synthetic Round \# 2


## OIL PAINT

You have the option of either using a small range of colours based on the Zorn palette below. The Zorn palette enables you to explore the tonal range of your subject while the large palette will give you a greater range of hue, value and chroma.

I use a mixture of Old Holland, Schminke, and Williamsburg.

Traditional Zorn Palette of four colours*

- Titanium White
- Yellow Ochre
- Cadmium Light/Vermillion Red
- Ivory Black

With the addition of (optional):

- Brilliant Yellow (light)
- Naples Yellow
- Burnt Umber
- Raw Umber
- Ultramarine Blue
