Robin White: Te Whanaketanga | Something is Happening Here opens at Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki this week

A major retrospective exhibition of contemporary New Zealand artist Dame Robin White (b.1946, Ngāti Awa, Pākehā) opens this Saturday at Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki following its successful threemonth display at Te Papa.

Featuring significant works from across White's 50-year career, the exhibition *Robin White: Te Whanaketanga* | *Something is Happening Here* profiles an artist whose imagery continues to shape the country's national identity and sense of place.

White has a special appreciation for Tāmaki Makaurau Auckland as the place where she grew up and completed a Diploma in Fine Arts at Elam School of Fine Arts, University of Auckland, in 1967.

'Auckland is the city where my art education began in a serious way, and visits to the Auckland City Art Gallery with my parents were a significant aspect of my early awakening to the importance of art. During these visits, I felt nurtured, nourished, and challenged,' says White. 'For my work to now be in the space that has been so important to me from when I was a child, is like a joyful homecoming. I hope that the exhibition of my work will support what the Gallery has to offer as a place for all to visit and enjoy.'

Accompanying the exhibition at Auckland Art Gallery is a series of free public programmes including professional learning days for primary and secondary school teachers, artist and curator talks, panel discussions, NZSL tours, and tours for blind and low vision visitors. A free bilingual Tamariki Guide to the exhibition is also available.

Gallery Director Kirsten Lacy says, 'We look forward to welcoming visitors this summer to see Robin White's remarkable works which are iconic images of the people and landscapes of Aotearoa and the Pacific. Bring the whole whānau, there's something for everyone to see and do.'

Robin White: Te Whanaketanga | Something is Happening Here has been developed by Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki in partnership with the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa. The exhibition is generously supported by Auckland Art Gallery Foundation.

Exhibition co-curators Dr Sarah Farrar, Head of Curatorial and Learning at Auckland Art Gallery, and Dr Nina Tonga, Curator Contemporary Art at Te Papa, say the exhibition provides timely recognition for an important New Zealand artist who responds to her local environment.

'Living, working and travelling across the Pacific and her experiences of working collaboratively with artists in Aotearoa, Fiji, Tonga and Japan, have transformed White's art practice' says Farrar.

Tonga says the exhibition aims to capture the intellectual curiosity and sense of purpose that has fueled White's work for the last fifty years.

'Across the exhibition we have charted the frequent innovations in her practice as she has responded to her changing environment, from her early wood-block prints to her most recent tapa works made in collaboration with Tongan artists, Ruha and Ebonie Fifita, and Fijian artist, Tamari Cabeikanacea.'

The exhibition also features work made in collaboration with Japanese artists Keiko limura and Taeko Ogawa.

Robin White: Te Whanaketanga | Something is Happening Here builds on over a decade of research by art historian and writer Jill Trevelyan and exhibition co-curators Dr Sarah Farrar and Dr Nina Tonga.

The exhibition is supported by an accompanying publication, *Robin White: Something is Happening Here*, jointly published by Te Papa Press and Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki which was released in May. The book includes fresh perspectives by 24 writers and interviewees from Aotearoa, Australia and Te Moana-Nui-a-Kiwa, the Pacific.
