
Toi Tū Toi Ora: Contemporary Māori Art

Toi Tū Toi Ora: Contemporary Māori Art at Britomart is a collaboration between Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki and the Britomart Arts Foundation. Four artists have been commissioned to create works to grace Britomart's nine blocks, forming a satellite exhibition that extends the magic of the Gallery's landmark show to the streets of downtown waterfront Auckland.

 A five-storey-high permanent installation
 by one of Aotearoa's most prominent artists.

- Lonnie Hutchinson Aroha ki te Ora
 A six-panel installation in Galway Street
 that references the Kāi Tahu creation story.
 Opposite the entrance to The Hotel
 Britomart, 29 Galway Street
- Charlotte Graham Te Hau Whakaora
 A flag-based installation that brings the healing energy of the wind and the sea through Britomart.
 The flags are on Te Ara Tahuhu (outside Ortolana), Takutai Square and in the Atrium on Takutai
- Lyonel Grant and Tim Gruchy
 SCOUT: Wawata Hōhonu
 Artist Tim Gruchy created SCOUT, an
 artwork with an ever-changing array of
 motion graphics on a stack of LED screens,
 in 2012. Now he's collaborated with master
 carver Lyonel Grant to create new material
 for SCOUT for Toi Tū Toi Ora.
