

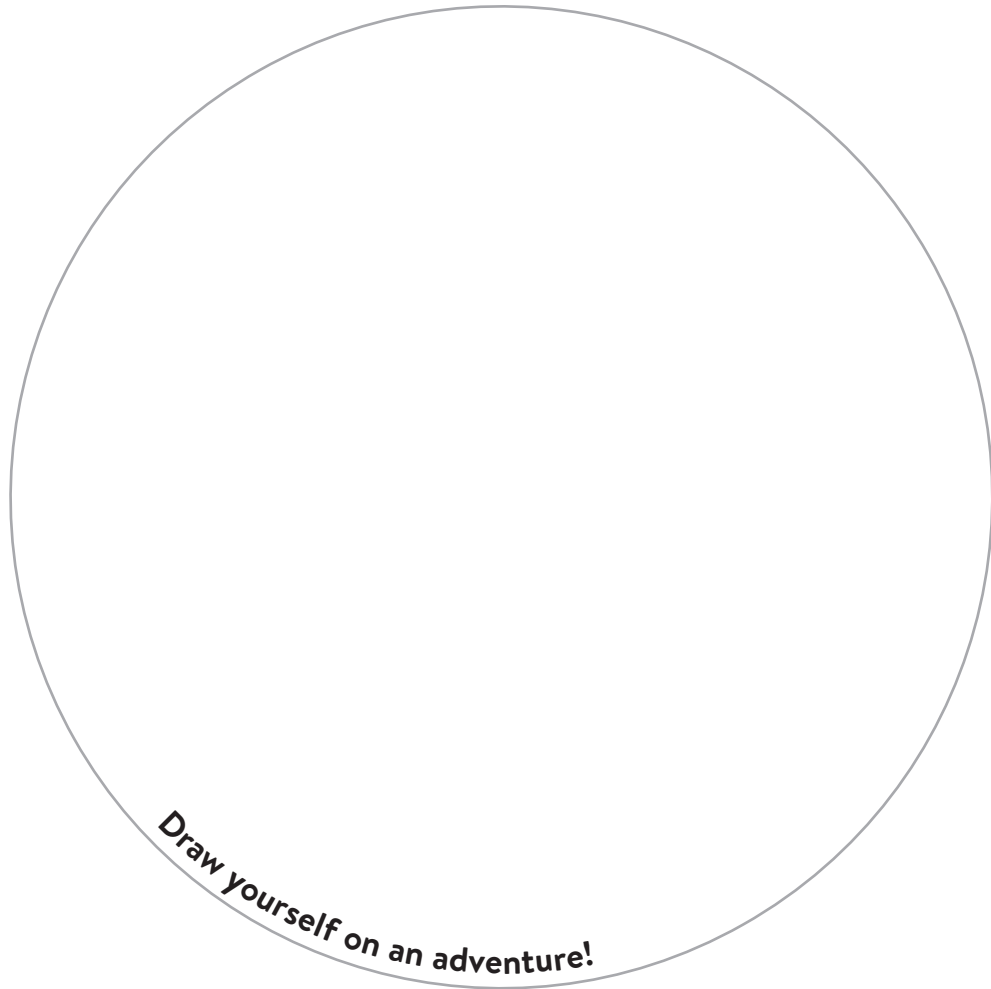

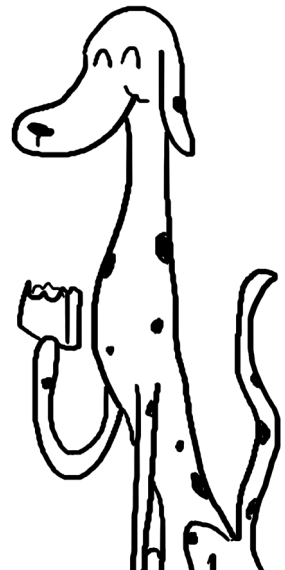

Make your own musical instrument!

This week we're making a kazoo! When you hum into a kazoo it creates a buzzing tone in the same note you've hummed, so you can play any song you know the tune to! Kazoos have snuck into songs by The Beatles, Broadway musicals, and even *Plants vs Zombies*. The kazoo is based on instruments that have been used in Africa for hundreds of years



You will need:

A roll of toilet paper

A rubber band

Patterned paper

A hole punch

Tissue paper

Scissors (ask a grownup for help)

Double-sided adhesive tape

Directions

1. Take patterned paper and mark the length of the roll then cut the paper.
2. Stick three pieces of tape: two on each end of the paper, and one in the centre.
3. Glue the paper onto the roll.
4. Cut out a piece of tissue paper (preferably square) and place it on one end of the roll.
5. Tie it with the elastic. Cut out the excess tissue paper.
6. Use the hole punch to make a hole in the kazoo.

And there you go! The kazoo is ready for you to play some music!





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
