Bathrooms

There are **bathrooms and accessible toilets located in the Aotea Centre** which are free to the public when the venue is open. There is **directional signage indicating where these are** or please ask for assistance and directions from any of our uniformed staff members.

Red Phone accessibility

Enclosed Space

This experience will take place **inside a small booth**. You will **need to stand inside** the booth, and there **isn't room for a wheelchair or chair**. There is only room for one person inside the booth.

Here is a photo of what one of the booths looks like with a person inside.




The booth has windows on three sides so you can see out even when the door is shut.

Reading Aloud

This experience **requires reading aloud**. The text will be on a **teleprompter**. The teleprompter has a night mode and day mode, depending on what the light is like outside. This means the screen will either have green text on a black background, or black text on a white background, depending on which will be more easily readable with the available light. The text will be in a fairly large font, no matter what colour it is.

Here is an example of what the green on black text looks like:



She's getting into the car.

One of the scripts has been printed in braille and is available on request.

You can read at your own pace, and no one except the person on the other end of the phone will be able to hear you.

Sound

This experience **requires listening** to what another participant in the other phone booth says and **responding with scripted answers**. The other person's voice will come through a speaker in the phone and may sound tinny. As you and the other person are both speaking live, the volume of their words may vary or may not always be clear.

You will only see your own lines on the teleprompter, so you won't be able to read what they are saying; you will only be able to hear it. You will not be able to see the other person while they are speaking.
