PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Experience the journeys of immigrants from the past and get your sea legs in the 1841 rocking cabin.

Beginning with the story of our first people, this Educator-led workshop will lead you on a journey through time to today's migrants. Together we will discover how people migrate and most importantly why. Students will reflect on their own whanau origins, their reasons for migrating, and their impact on the changing face of Aotearoa New Zealand.

The workshop is complemented by a self-guided immigration trail that explores the Museum's taonga including Te Waka, an animated short film showing the Pacific migration of the early Polynesians. Students will work in small groups, led by their adult supervisors, to follow their own interests and learn at their own pace.
