Petrel Patrol

Have you ever heard of Petrel Patrol? It's a super cool group of people who help seabirds who sometimes get into trouble.

Tītī (Cook's petrel) are amazing birds that fly all the way across the ocean, but when they come back to land, they can get confused by the city lights. Sometimes they crash into buildings or get stuck on the ground and can't fly away. That's where the Petrel Patrol steps in! They search for these lost birds at dawn, pick them up gently, and take them to a safe place, like BirdCare, which is a wild bird hospital. Then, they release the petrels back into the wild where they can continue their adventures.







What do I do if I find an injured bird?

- Keep it in a quiet, warm location e.g. box with a towel in it.
- Take it to your nearest DOC-permitted rehabilitation centre (like BirdCare) or a vet or contact SPCA if you are unsure.
- Don't handle the bird unnecessarily, they don't like cuddles or stroking. It's best to be very quiet too.
- Leave it to the experts to release the bird. They know where the bird will have the best chance of success.
