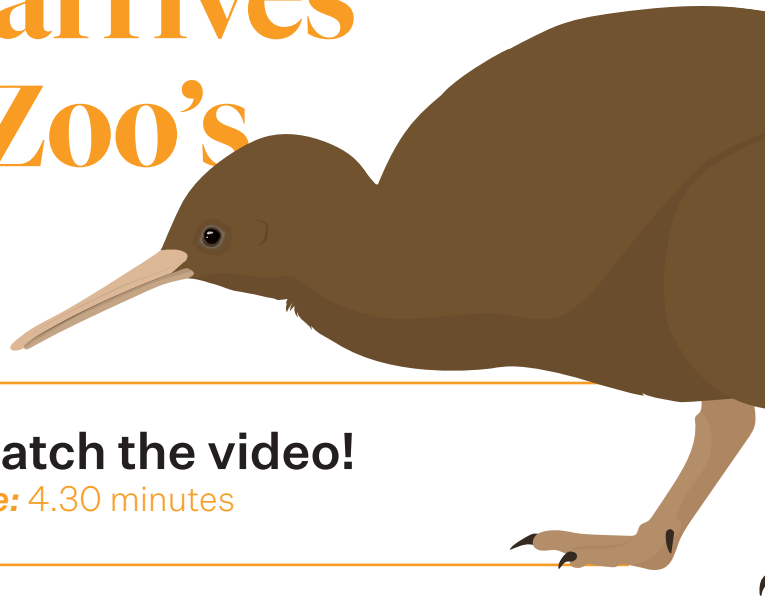


Injured kiwi arrives at Auckland Zoo's Vet Hospital

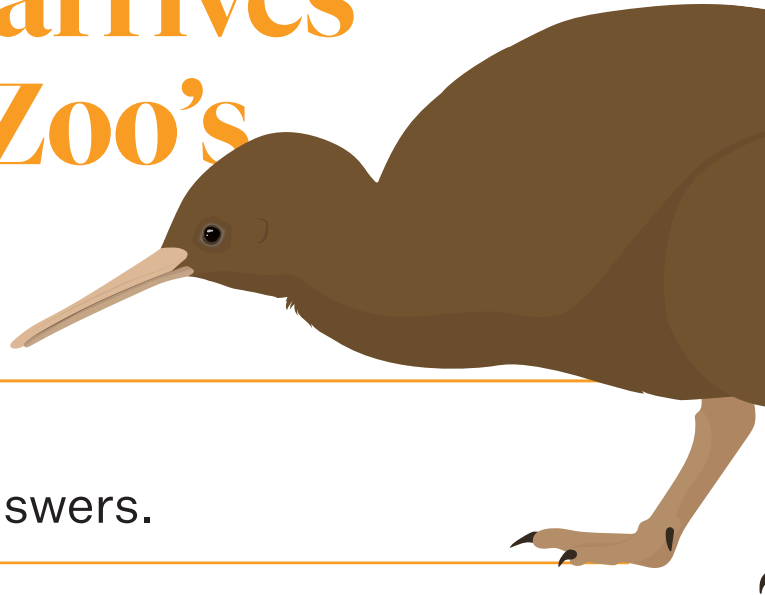

Now it's time to check your answers.

1. The injured bird was found in the Coromandel.
2. The kiwi was bitten by a dog.
3. Knuckling means that the kiwi is curling over its toes.
4. The redness on the kiwi's skin means that there is a lot of damage under the skin.
5. The dog bites and then it shakes the kiwi so it causes internal damage to the kiwi.
6. Beak damage is a big issue for kiwi because their sense of smell is really important for them to find kai (food).
7. The x-ray sign is bright kōwhai (yellow).
8. The rata kararehe (vet) is making sure that there isn't any damage to the kiwi's bones.
9. Dog owners should keep their dog on a lead/leash so that the dog can't hurt any kiwi.
10. Various answers. Teacher judgment required.
